
Point-in-Time & Housing Inventory Count



- The Point-In-Time (PIT) Count is a count of sheltered and unsheltered people experiencing homelessness on a single night in January.
 - Unsheltered individuals are recorded homeless if they were surveyed during the 24 hour PIT count timeframe.
 - □ Two types of surveys were used for the PIT Count: Observed and Interviewed.
 - Observed : Any individual who declined an interviewed survey, and was determined by the surveyor to be "definitely" homeless.
 - Interviewed : Individuals who agreed to answer an array of questions about their current homeless situation.
 - Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) requires that Continuums of Care (CoC) conduct an annual count of people experiencing homelessness who are sheltered in emergency shelter, transitional housing, and safe havens on a single night.
 - The Housing Inventory Count (HIC) is a point-in-time inventory of provider programs within a CoC that provides beds and units dedicated to serve people experiencing homelessness; categorized by five program types: Emergency Shelter, Transitional Housing, Rapid Re-housing, Safe Haven, and Permanent Supportive Housing.
 - Palm Beach County PIT Count took place from 12:00 PM on Thursday January 26th, 2023 to 12:00 PM on Friday January 27th, 2023.
 - Palm Beach County employees and volunteers divided into groups to cover all of PBC (geographically) to count individuals experiencing homelessness within the 24 hour period.

PIT – Sheltered Count 2023



- □ 686 persons sheltered.
 - **563** persons in Emergency Shelter.
 - □ 123 persons in Transitional Housing.








PIT – Unsheltered Count 2023

- 1,169 Unsheltered persons experiencing homelessness were counted during the 2023 PIT Count.
 - □ 918 Homeless surveys conducted.
 - 251 Observations conducted.









2023 PIT Count – Sheltered/Unsheltered

- The chart below shows the amount of homeless individuals counted in sheltered/unsheltered locations.
- Sheltered Individuals that reside in Emergency Shelter, Transitional Housing programs or Safe Havens.
- Unsheltered Individuals that reside in a place not meant for habitation (i.e., abandoned building, vehicle, camp-site).








2023 PIT Count – Household Type

- The graph below shows how many "Single Persons" and "Families" were surveyed in the last five PIT Counts.
- □ A few key notes from the data below:
 - □ Single persons increased by 345 persons from 2022 to 2023.
 - □ Families rose by 107 from 2022 to 2023.
 - □ The overall PIT Count increased by 452 from 2022 to 2023.








2023 PIT Count – Race


□ The Sheltered and Unsheltered pie charts below represent how many individuals were counted in the PIT Count then that data is broken down by race.

The Sheltered and Unsheltered pie charts represent how many individuals were counted in the PIT Count then that data is broken down by ethnicity and shown below.








2023 PIT Count – Shelters

- This chart represents our partner agencies who counted homeless individuals in their shelters on the night of the PIT Count. The Homeless Resource Center (HRC) is funded by PBC and run by Gulfstream Goodwill Industries Inc. and Adopt-A-Family of the Palm Beaches Inc.
- □ A total of 687 persons were sheltered.
- **G** 564 persons in Emergency Shelter and 123 persons in Transitional Housing.



Persons in Shelter (ES - TH)





The highest number of unsheltered individuals were counted in District 7 with a count of 513.

District 6 had the second highest number with an unsheltered count of 188.


District 2 had the third highest number with an unsheltered count of 149.

Less than 100 individuals were counted in each of the remaining, individual, districts.




Palm Beach County 2022 to 2023 Unsheltered Locations Comparison by Districts

This table represent zip codes in PBC that saw an increase or decrease in unsheltered individuals from 2022 to 2023.




□ The charts below compare the amount of sheltered individuals in Emergency Shelter and Transitional Housing in 2022 and 2023.





2022 to 2023 PIT Count – Subpopulations

- The graphs below show the subpopulations for both Sheltered and Unsheltered individuals in the 2022 and 2023 PIT Count.
- One subpopulation that saw a significant increase from 2022 to 2023 is Sheltered Domestic violence victims which saw a decrease of 46 individuals.








2022 to 2023 PIT Count by Race

- The pie charts below represent the race of individuals that were counted in the 2022 and 2023 PIT count.
- □ A few key notes from the data below are:
 - From 2022 to 2023 there was a noticeable increase of Black or African-American individuals who identified as homeless with a total increased amount of 349.
 - □ All other races saw a slight increase or stayed even from 2022 to 2023.








Special Populations 2018-2023


The bar graph below shows how many persons experiencing homelessness represent a special population categories (Veterans, Seniors, Youth, Chronic) within the last five PIT Counts.






Count of Individuals and Families in 2022 and 2023

The bar graphs below represent the total number of single persons and families (Persons) categorized by unsheltered and sheltered that were counted during the 2022 and 2023 PIT Count.






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
2022 and 2023 PIT Count Unsheltered Health Conditions

- The unsheltered pie charts represent how many individuals self identified as having one or more health conditions during the 2022 and 2023 PIT Counts.
- The data below suggests that self identifying health conditions declined from 2022 to 2023 in some categories by wide margins like Substance Use disorder; however, others rose like Domestic Violence Survivors which rose by 21 adults.





The graph below shows the number of unsheltered persons experiencing homelessness by their reported or perceived age.














2022 and 2023 PIT Count - Unsheltered – Chronic Homeless

- Chronic Homelessness 12 consecutive months homeless or 4+ occasions totaling 12 months over a span of 3 years.
